Quest Open House events are held every two months when the Quest Trustees are in Sandpoint for Board meetings.



Each meeting is unique with special milestones such as October 16, 2002 when we dedicated our initial 27,000 sq ft R&D facility. Last year on October 16th we celebrated our first Kodiak flight. Now on October 13, 2005, over 200 guests gathered to dedicate to God the completion of our 84,000 sq ft manufacturing facility. We were honored and blessed by 60 missionary delegates from 10 participating mission organizations who already have 18 Kodiaks on order.



Our non-flying prototype is in FAA testing for Certification.

This horizontal tail withstood 3,000 pounds of pull to its limit

testing load. Every part of the airframe will be stressed in this way beyond normal usage. These tests, along with over 200 spin tests of our flying prototype, are the biggest challenges we face as we work toward the expected FAA approval by spring. This is an exciting time. We ask you to pray for us and stand with us to the end. ***I know you will!***

This project is Herculean and the results are likewise world-wide and mission-wide. These benefits will soon be self-funded and continue for decades through commercial sales profits. This is truly significant and historic.
