



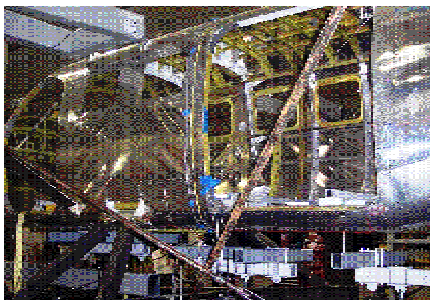

Dear Praying and Supporting Friends,

Let me say a very BIG **THANK YOU** to each one of you who gave or pledged so generously at the year-end. This has cut our remaining funding need to about \$1,500,000. We are now in our heaviest spending period of the entire program to pay for the building, new machinery, and increasing payroll for our 60 employees. A reality check of the magnitude of this project is that in December we spent \$546,538 on wages and operating expenses and \$719,200 for another payment on our new CNC machinery! We praise God and thank each of you for making this possible!

In spite of our timeline slip over the past few months, your giving has kept pace with spending. However, the end is again in sight and the remaining need is dropping. Our timeline and budget are still well below industry norms. This is significant! Things are going well and on track to see FAA approvals in hand by mid year if our remaining tests continue to go well. Please pray and stick with us a bit longer as we press on to success. *We will get there soon!*

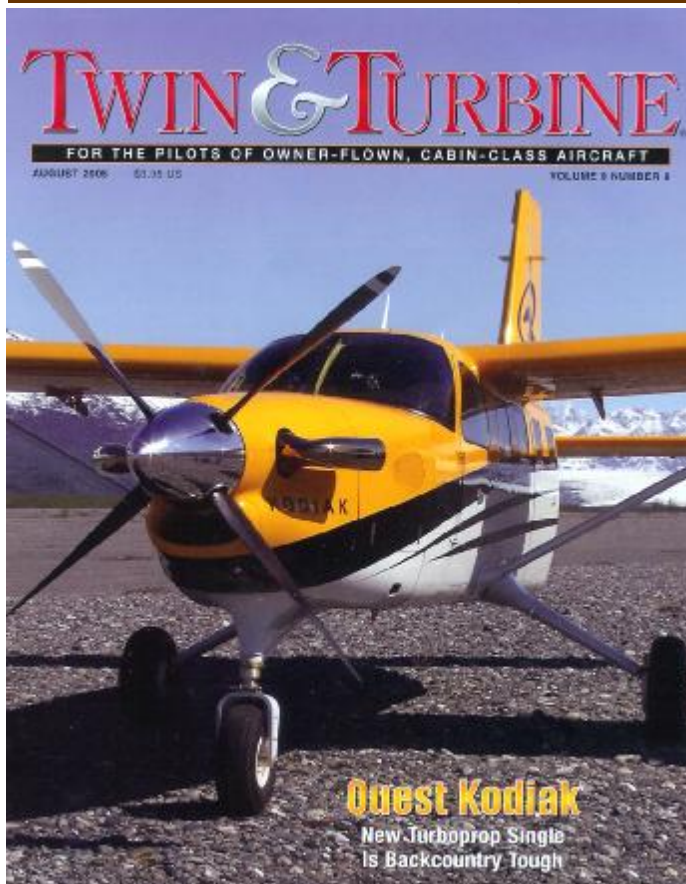
lb. test where we can have airframe damage but not catastrophic failure. This is the “mother of all tests” so do pray all goes well. If it passes that test we will begin building production Kodiaks immediately as we complete the many minor remaining tests and FAA paperwork.

Global Mapping recently determined there will soon be 1 billion “roadless” people in the world. MAF’s December newsletter states - “Our **OPERATION-ACCESS** study has identified 364 locations in 64 countries where people are cut off from the Gospel by terrain. We’ve also discovered that there are far more people than imagined in this condition. It means we must redouble our efforts and commitment in order to fulfill the Great Commission.”
